



# *The Plan of the Day* Oliver P. Morton and the Civil War in Indiana



The talk examines Morton's role as War Governor, as he mobilized the state for war, became known as "The Soldiers' Friend," supported the Union cause, and fought the Copperheads. A polarizing figure in his own time, Morton continues to divide historians, most of whom see him as either a tyrant or as a political opportunist. This lecture helps place his actions in context, showing how he consistently held to his nationalist principles even as he did take advantage of political opportunities.

#### The Newspaper Speaks

*The Indiana Herald* (Huntington, Indiana) Wednesday, April 24, 1861, page 3 Proclamation by the Governor.

WHEREAS, An armed rebellion has been organized in certain States of this Union, having for its purpose the overthrow of the Government of the United States.

AND WHEREAS, The authors and movers in this rebellion have seized by violence various forts and arsenals belonging to the United States, and otherwise plundered the Government of large amounts of money and valuable property.

AND WHEREAS, Fort Sumter a fortress belonging to the United States, the exclusive possession and jurisdiction over which were vested in the General government by the Constitution of the United States, has been besieged by a large army and assaulted by a destructive cannonade, and reduced to submission and the National Flag hauled down and dishonored.

AND WHEREAS, The President of the United States, in the exercise of the power vested in him by the Federal Constitution, has called upon the several States remaining true to their allegiance, to aid him in the enforcement of the laws the recovery of the national property, and the maintenance of the rightful authority of the United States.

Now, therefore, I, Oliver P. Morton, Governor of the State of Indiana, call upon loyal and patriotic men of this State, to the number of six regiments, to organize themselves into military companies, and forthwith report the same to the Adjutant General, in order that they may be speedily mustered into the service of the United States. The details of the organization are set forth in the instructions of the Adjutant General, herewith published.

Photo and information from Find A Grave memorial # 7953 **Oliver Perry Morton** was born August 4, 1823 in Wayne County, Indiana. He served at lieutenant governor in 1861, governor from January 16, 1861 to January 23, 1867, U.S. senator from 1867 to 1877, and unsuccessfully ran for president in 1876. He died November 1, 1877 and lies buried in Lot 37, Section 9 of Crown Hill Cemetery in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Oliver P. Morton statue is located at the Soldiers and Sailors Monument in downtown Indianapolis. It was originally erected June 15, 1884 at the center of Circle Park (now Monument Circle), relocated in 1899 to its current site as part of the Soldiers and Sailors Monument, and dedicated May 15, 1902. The inscription reads, "Oliver P. Morton, 'The War Governor' of Indiana, War of the Rebellion, 1861 - 1865."
